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

Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited college or university with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Online application
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions attended
- Minimum combined GRE score of 280
- Two letters of recommendation
- Personal statement/statement of interest detailing why you have chosen this program of study
- Passing scores from Praxis I and II

Note: Passing scores from Praxis I:

• Praxis 1 may be waived if an applicant has an ACT score of 22 (composite), a SAT score of 1030 (combined verbal/critical reading and math), or an advanced degree.
