Executive Summary

The 2023-2024 Xavier University of Louisiana Profile provides information that focuses on freshmen, the student body, graduates, and faculty and staff. The data presented are based on Fall 2023 census data.

Xavier's 2023 freshman class consists of 692 students, with 249 in the Biology Department, 114 in the Psychology Department, and 94 in the Chemistry Department. The remaining students chose majors across the College of Arts and Sciences. Eighty-three percent of the freshman class are Black or African American, 4% are two or more races, 5% are Hispanic, 3% are Asian, 1% are White, and 3% are U.S. Non-Residents. Freshmen come from 36 states, the District of Columbia, Military locations, Puerto Rico, and 12 foreign countries; the top five states are Louisiana, Texas, Illinois, Georgia, and California. The average ACT of the freshman class is 22.1, the average SAT score is 1063, and the average high school GPA is 3.6.

Xavier's overall student enrollment in Fall 2023 is 3,181 with 2,586 undergraduate students and 178 graduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences, 412 students in the College of Pharmacy, and 5 consortium students. Seventy-nine percent of the student body is Black or African American, 4% are White, 4% are Asian, 4% are Hispanic, 4% are two or more races, 3% are U.S. Non-Resident, and 3% are unknown.

In 2023, the University awarded 668 degrees: 420 Bachelor's, 106 Master's, and 142 Doctoral. The six-year graduation rate of the 2017 freshman class is 47.5%; the four-year graduation rate of the 2019 freshman class is 40.5%. The retention rate into the second year for the 2022 freshman class is 70.8%.

In Fall 2023, there are 254 full-time faculty. Of these, 199 are teaching faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences, 47 are teaching faculty in the College of Pharmacy, and eight are non-teaching library faculty. 38.6% of Xavier's full-time faculty are Black or African American, 34% percent are White, 15% are U.S. Non-Resident, 7% are Asian, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 7% are Other. Forty-four percent of faculty are tenured, 33% are non-tenure track, and 23% are tenure track. In addition, 94% of Xavier's full-time faculty hold terminal degrees. Assistant Professors comprise 43% of teaching faculty, with 27% Associate Professors, 24% Professors, and 7% Instructors/Lecturers. The University student-faculty ratio is 11.1:1; the College of Arts and Sciences ratio is 11.2:1; and ratios of the College of Pharmacy's programs are: 8:1 for the Pharmacy program and 15.2:1 for the Physician Assistant Program. There are 450 full-time and 27 part-time staff members. Of these, 80% are Black or African American, 7% are White, 7% are U.S. Non-Resident, 2% are Hispanic, 1% are Two or More Races, 1% are Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, 1% are Asian, and 1% are unknown.
