 - A variety of other health professions (except pharmacy)




- PM Office is <u>NOT</u> a part of an academic department; support office in College of A&S
- PM Office supplements advising offered within academic departments & other support offices
- "Pre-Med"/"Pre-Health" is NOT an academic major
- Most XU premeds major in Biology-Premed, Chemistry-Premed, or Psychology-Premed, but can complete "premed" courses in ANY major

- Advising activities at Xavier...
 - <u>INFORM</u> premeds to cultivate <u>competitive</u> apps for HP schools
 - <u>SUPPORT</u> premeds with a variety of app prep services throughout enrollment
 - **ENCOURAGE** premeds to develop cognitive & non-cognitive elements of apps so <u>the answer to each of the two questions</u> <u>typically asked by admissions committees is "YES!"</u>



- 1st EAP partner; most frequently applied to program
- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.5 overall GPA
- MCAT (min. composite 70th percentile)





U of Rochester Medical School (NY)

- 2nd most frequently applied to EAP; 1st in matriculants
- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.6 overall GPA
- MCAT <u>waived</u>
- Entry years 2009-2021...
 - 38 matriculated
 - 2 enrolled in MD/PhD program





St. Louis U Medical School

- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.5 overall & 3.4
 BCPM GPAs
- MCAT (min. composite 500)





Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth

- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.5 overall & BCPM GPAs
- MCAT (min. composite 503)





Michigan State U College of Human Medicine

- Apply early spring junior/senior year
- Min. 3.0 overall & BCPM GPAs
- MCAT (min. composite 500)
- Senior applicants cannot have previously applied via AMCAS, AACOMAS, or TMDSAS





Penn State U Medical School

- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.5 overall GPA
- MCAT (min. composite 50th percentile)





LSU-New Orleans Medical School

- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.6 BCPM GPA
- MCAT (min. composite 501)
- Full scholarship for eligible LA residents





Baylor College of Medicine


- Apply end of fall sophomore year
- Required summer research
- Min. 3.5 overall & BCPM GPAs
- MCAT (min. composite 502)





U Penn Medical School

- Apply early spring sophomore year
- Required research program(2 summers)
- Min. 3.6 overall & BCPM GPAs
- ACT/SAT (min. composite 29/1300)
- MCAT waived





U of South Alabama SouthMed Prep Scholars Program


- Apply fall FR or SO year
- AL residents (some counties in MS & FL)
- Required research program (2 summers)
- Min. 3.5 overall & 3.4 BCPM GPAs
- ACT/SAT (min. 25/1200 ACT/SAT)
- MCAT (min. composite 499)





UAB Dental School

- Apply early spring sophomore year
- Required participation in UAB Dental <u>SHPEP</u> summer after SO year
- Min. 3.5 overall & BCP GPAs
- DAT (min. 18 section scores)
- Guaranteed scholarships





U of Southern California Physical Therapy Program

- Apply end of spring sophomore year
- Min. 3.2 overall & science GPAs
- GRE (no min.)





Rush U Nursing School

- Apply fall/spring of senior year
- MSN for Non-Nurses (Clinical Nurse Leader)
- Min. 3.0 overall & science GPAs
- GRE req. if overall GPA <3.0





Partnership Program Benefits

- Early identification of mission-aligned students
- Early assurance, summer program, and/or AY mentorship
- Targeted engagement broadens scope of holistic review


