Remembering

NAT "SWEETWATER" CLIFTON

Xavier, 1941-42

Nat "Sweetwater" Clifton played just one season of basketball at Xavier (1941-42), but his impact on basketball was profound. Clifton played for the Harlem Globetrotters after Xavier, then became one of the first African-Americans to sign with an NBA team (1950) and one of three to break the league's color barrier in the 1950-51 season. According to NBA.com, he was the first African-American to appear in the NBA Finals. In eight NBA seasons (1950-58), Clifton averaged 10 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. He spent his first seven seasons with the New York Knicks before playing the 1957-58 season with the Detroit Pistons. Clifton still holds the NBA record for the oldest first-time participant in an All-Star Game: 34 years and 3 months. He was one of just 12 to play at a Louisiana college and be selected for an NBA All-Star Game. His honors are many. Clifton is a member of the Chicago Sports Hall of Fame and the Black Athletes Hall of Fame. The Associated Black Charities of New York City named one of its "Black History Maker Awards" the "Nathaniel 'Sweetwater' Clifton Award," and in 2005 the Knicks renamed their monthly "City Spirit Award" in his honor. In 1993, longtime NBA referee Earl Strom listed Clifton as one of his 10 toughest players of all time (also listed: Willis Reed and Karl Malone). Clifton was born October 13, 1922, in Little Rock, Ark., and died August 31, 1990, in Chicago. His Xavier statistics are spotty, but the school newspaper, the Xavier Herald, said Clifton scored 42 points against Benedict and 24 in another game.

COACH G.O. WRIGHT

Xavier, 1937-46



Giles O. "G.O." Wright coached Xavier more than 60 years ago, but he still holds the school record for career winning percentage by a men's basketball coach.

Wright's teams were 160-40 (.800) in nine seasons, including 104-10 (.912) with three Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships the first four seasons. Xavier was 29-0 in 1940-41 and had an average winning margin of 15 points.

Wright was inducted into the Louisiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2000.

Remembering
WARNER SAUNDERS

Xavier, 1953-57



From the 1930s through the 1950s, it was not unusual for Xavier rosters to include athletes from Chicago high schools. Warner Saunders of Corpus Christi High was part of the pipeline.

“My high school coach, Lawrence Bingley, played at Xavier,” Saunders said. “That’s how I made it down there.”

Saunders, a 6-foot-5 center, played four seasons of varsity basketball for the Gold Rush (1953-57) and captained the team his senior year. He graduated, returned to Chicago and became a Windy City broadcasting legend. During his 38 years of broadcasting, Saunders has won 19 Chicago Emmy awards and been inducted into the Chicago Journalism Hall of Fame and the Chicago Television Academy’s Silver Circle.

Saunders anchors news broadcasts for Chicago’s NBC affiliate, WMAQ-TV.

“I have so many memories from Xavier,” Saunders said. “We had a great rivalry with Dillard. Another memory was when we walked into St. Michael’s dormitory for the first time. That was a red-letter day. We had stayed in old Army barracks for two years. When we moved into the dormitory, we thought we had died and gone to heaven.”

Xavier resumed its basketball program in 1967 after a seven-year absence. But it was not until the early 1970s, when forward Bruce Seals and guard Donald "Slick" Watts were teammates, that the Gold Rush got the jump-start it needed to return to prominence.

During a two-year stretch (1971-73), Seals and Watts combined for 2,101 points and led Xavier to a 43-11 record, two NAIA District 30 championships and back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 1930s. The Gold Rush also upset top-ranked Sam Houston State in 1973 and advanced to the NAIA quarterfinals for the only time in school history.

Seals and Watts spent the rest of the '70s playing professionally, and they were teammates for parts of three seasons (1975-78) with the Seattle SuperSonics.

The Sonics traded Watts to the New Orleans Jazz during the 1977-78 season, and Seals remained in Seattle and helped the Sonics reach the NBA Finals for the first time. But before Watts left Seattle, he became the first of four players to lead the NBA in assists per game and steals per game in the same season. He accomplished that in 1975-76, the same season he received the NBA's J. Walter Kennedy Citizenship Award for exemplary community service.

Both Seals and Watts are members of the Louisiana Basketball Hall of Fame. Seals is the athletic director of the Colonel Daniel Marr Boys and Girls Club in Dorchester, Mass., and Watts is a physical education teacher in Seattle.

"Although I left two years ahead of time, I thoroughly enjoyed my time at Xavier, academically and athletically," Seals said. "Xavier was good to me in more ways than one. I met my wife there. When things get real tough, I think about how good I had it there. I also remember beating Dillard all the time. Being at Xavier is one of the highlights of my career."
