Gulf Coast Athletic Conference

All six Xavier teams — men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and men's and women's tennis — compete in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference. The league has NAIA Division I affiliation and is comprised of colleges in Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama.

The GCAC began competition in the 1981-82 school year with seven members: Belhaven, Dillard, Louisiana College, Spring Hill, Tougaloo, William Carey and Xavier. Louisiana College left the conference after the 1999-2000 school year. Mobile and SUNO began competing in the GCAC in 1986-87, followed by Loyola in 1995-96 and LSU-Shreveport in 2002-03.

SUNO and LSU-Shreveport are the only public schools in the conference.

The GCAC also awards championships in baseball, softball and women's volleyball. The

conference honors student-athletes who maintain a grade-point average of 3.0 or higher and awards the Thomas Howell Cup — which is named for the longtime GCAC commissioner — to the school with the highest composite ranking in GCAC-sponsored sports.

All 10 members compete in men's and women's basketball, and each team plays an 18-game conference schedule. Schools compete for two championships — the regular-season title and the tournament title.

Winners of the men's and women's basketball postseason tournaments receive the GCAC's automatic bids to the NAIA national tournaments. GCAC Tournament teams will be seeded according to their finish in the regular-season standings, and the highest remaining seeds will play host to tournament games in each of the four rounds.
