### eligibility

If you are a faculty member or administrator at a two-year or four-year higher education institution, you're eligible (though we do consider education professionals at other institutions on a case-by-case basis). You need not be an expert to participate, and we encourage educators from all academic disciplines to apply.

### application process

The application is available on our website at [www.ciece.org/ifds](http://www.ciece.org/ifds). After clicking the link 'Apply Online,' you will find a step-by-step guide to the process. The application consists of an online form, including a one-page statement of purpose describing your teaching and research interests and how you expect to benefit professionally from the seminar. The application fee can be paid online with a credit card, or by mailing a personal or university check. After you've submitted your application, you can also monitor its status and receive pre-departure information using the same account.
