**(Required of ALL students. They are non-refundable and due at the time of submission of completed application)**

**PAY ATTENTION TO THE FOLLOWING:**

1. Registration, Tuition, and Technology (Master's of Theology Degree students only) fees are due by May 15, 2012, for early and regular applications ONLY. For late applications, fees are due no later than June 21, 2012. Non-receipt of payment at these times may result in automatic deregistration. Returned checks will result in immediate deregistration and a charge of \$30.00.
2. If the student's tuition and required fees are included in a check issued by a joint sponsoring agent or group, be sure to supply accompanying documentation that **clearly identifies** the name of the student, his/her program of study, and any **itemized monetary disbursements**.
3. **Do not include** money for the student's textbooks, class materials, supplies, copying, etc. in the tuition and fee check.
4. **Make and bring** a documentation file containing copies of **all** application information with you: correspondence, application, health clearance, checks and related data, etc.
