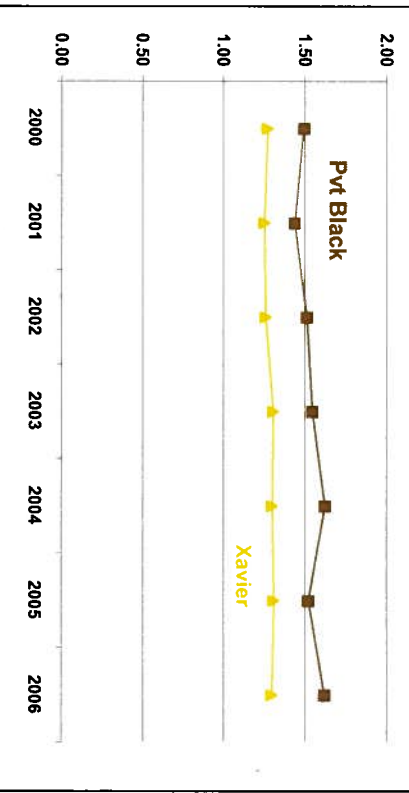
**Xavier Compared to Private Black Colleges  
First and Third or More Choice of Schools**



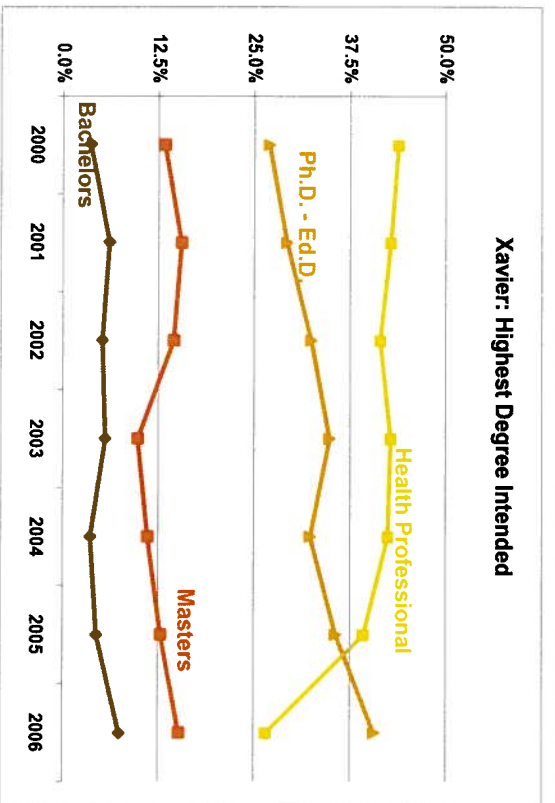
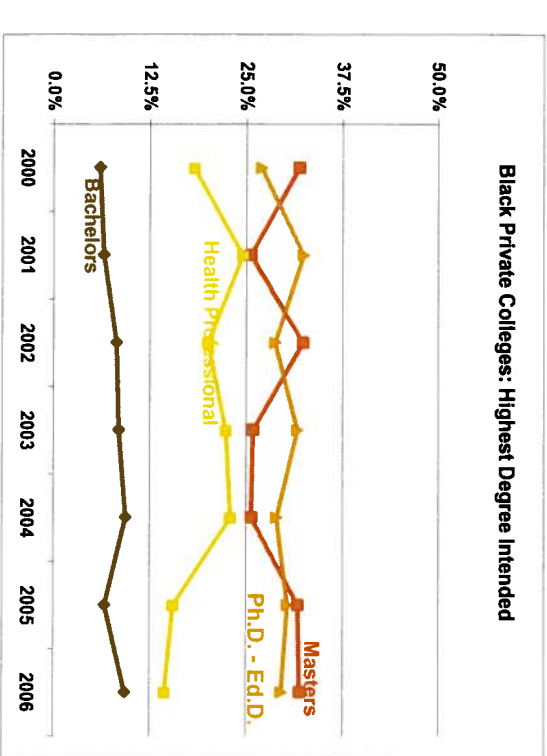
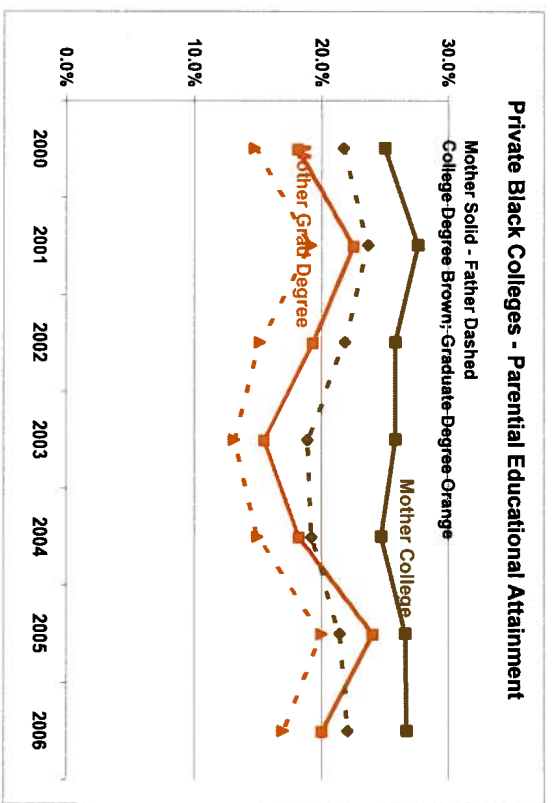
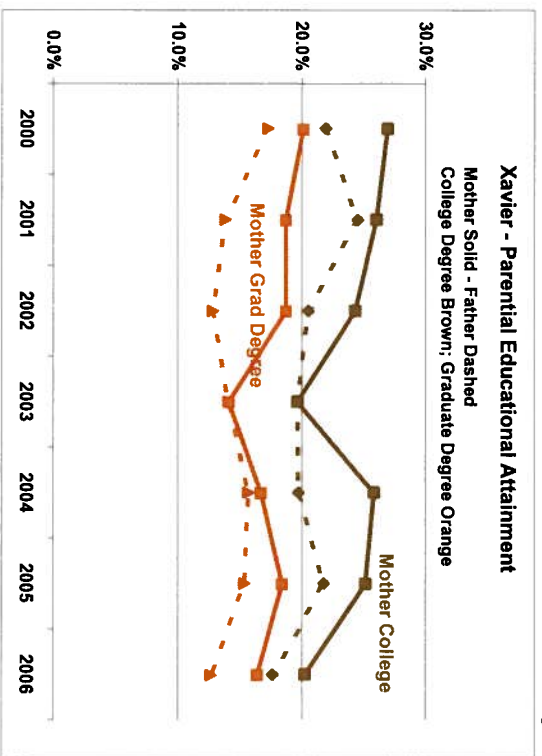
**Xavier Compared to Private Black Colleges  
Number of Schools Applied To**



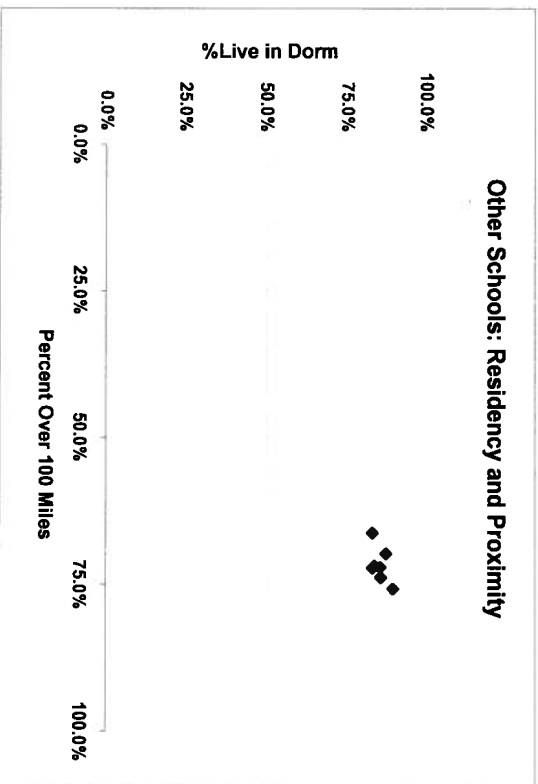
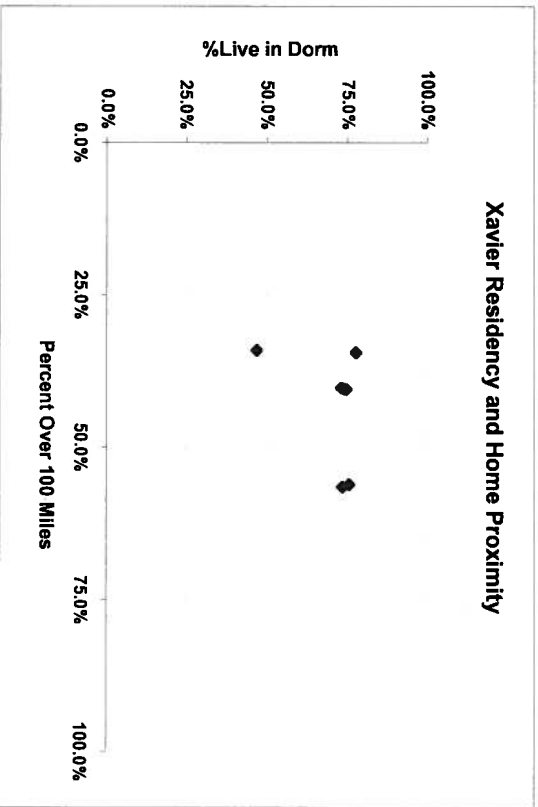
