

III. Graduates

The graduation rate of students enrolled since 2000 in 4-year programs (excluding students in Pharmacy or pre-engineering) is shown in Table 22.

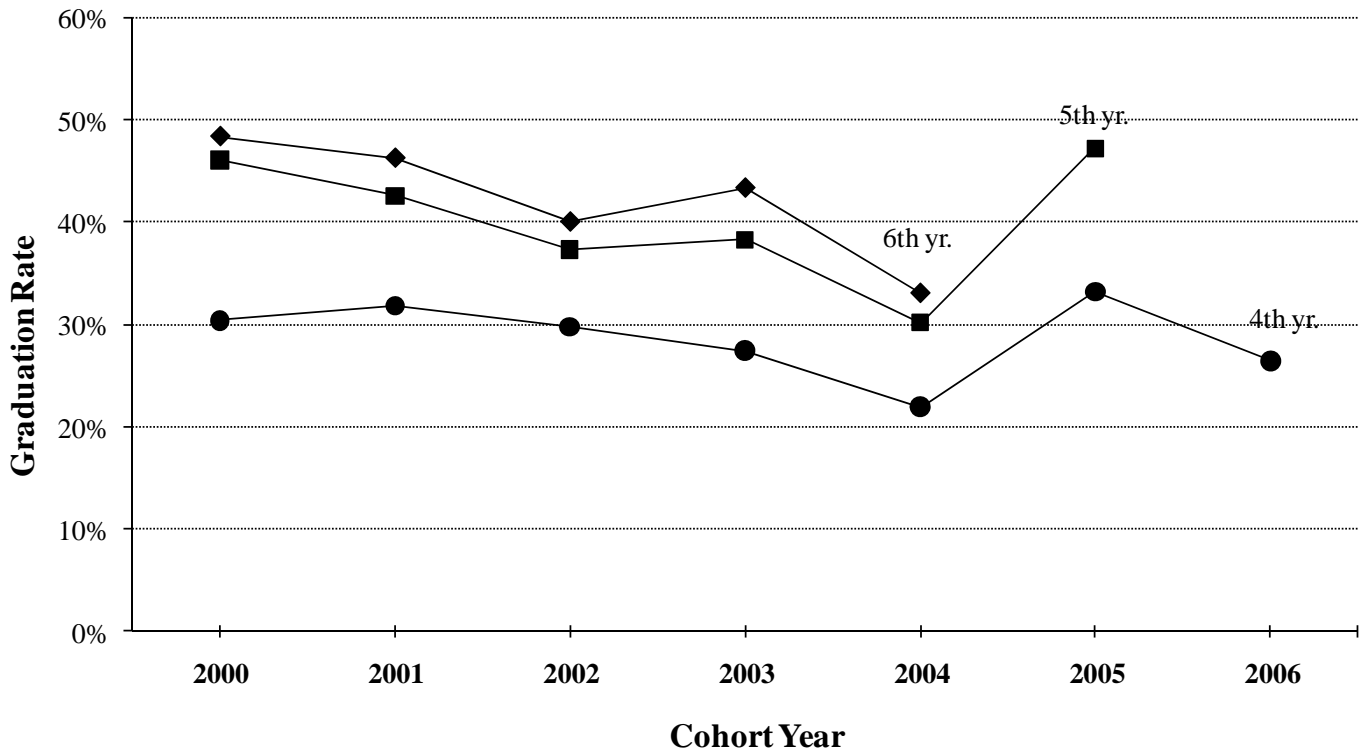
Since Xavier's enrollment is heaviest in the natural sciences, this area has the largest percentage of graduates from within the College of Arts & Sciences, as is shown in Table 23 and Table 24. Table 25a provides the number of graduates, by ethnicity and gender, in each academic discipline within the College of Arts & Sciences. Table 25b provides same information for graduates of the College of Pharmacy and the Graduate School.

Xavier's students are attending graduate and professional schools at a rate that reflects the efforts of Xavier faculty, staff and administration. Data supplied from the National Student Clearinghouse is presented in Tables 26 – 28. As shown in Table 26, the percent of students from the College of Arts and Sciences who enrolled in graduate/professional school in the fall or spring semester after graduation was 31.2% for 2009–10 graduates. Within the Natural Sciences and Math disciplines, more than 1 of every 3 students attended graduate/professional school during the fall semester after graduation. Table 27 gives the breakdown by major of Arts & Sciences 2006–2010 graduates who attended graduate/professional school in the fall or spring semester following graduation. Table 28 highlights the disciplines and areas of concentration in which our graduates are pursuing graduate/professional degrees.

Table 29 indicates the breakdown by major of graduates from Xavier's Graduate School. On the last page of this section, post-graduation information regarding graduate/professional school, as well as job placement, is presented in the "Whatever Happened to the Class of 2010" table.

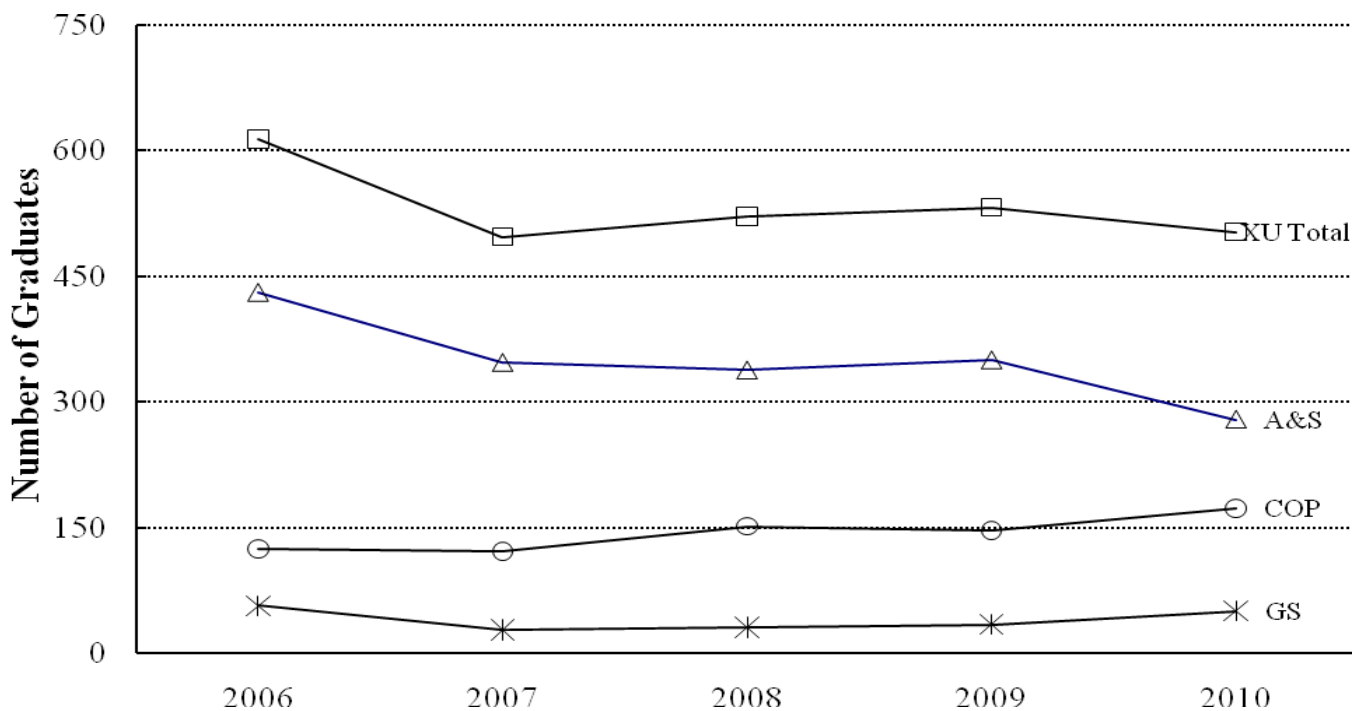

Two hundred seventy-nine (279) students graduated from Xavier's College of Arts and Sciences. Here is what we know about this group¹ (as of January 1, 2011):

87 (31.2%) entered Graduate or Professional school:

-  58 entered Graduate School
-  7 entered Medical School
-  7 entered Public Health School
-  5 entered Pharmacy School
-  4 entered Dental School
-  2 entered Law School
-  2 entered Post-Baccalaureate Programs
-  1 entered Business School
-  1 entered Osteopathy School

39 (14.0%) are Working or in Other School:

-  16 are working at Banks, Stores, *etc.*
-  11 are working in Field of Study or Doing Research
-  7 are enrolled in Other School (community college/general studies)
