

comprehension skills appropriate for service delivery. A minimum TOEFL score of 600 on the paper-based exam, or 100 on the internet-based exam, must be achieved on a test taken within the last two years. Students may be referred for accent reduction or ESL instruction.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited college or university with a minimum 3.2 GPA in your field of study
- 3 letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts from every college or university attended.
- Successful completion of a face-to-face interview, upon invitation.
- Personal statement
- Graduate Record Exam (GRE) score requirements include a 280 minimum combined score. (Verbal & Quantitative Reasoning)
- As part of the application process, applicants must clearly express in writing their views on cultural and linguistic diversity. They must also pass a communication screening as part of their initial interview. Students who are not native speakers of English will be required to pass the TOEFL and demonstrate English speaking

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
