



It's about changing the world, one Xavierite at a time.


As Saint Katharine said, and as so many Xavierites have done before us, we will "Press Forward. Fear Nothing."




Putting the sent in representation


we attracted exceptional faculty that created new pathways for students and representation?

PRIORITY

Increasing Affordability & Access Through **Financial Assistance**

Like students across the country today, many Xavierites struggle to meet the costs of college. The need for financial assistance is significant: 94% of our undergraduates apply for and receive some form of needbased financial aid.

We will break financial barriers and ensure equal access to our transformative education. With additional funding for financial support, we will focus on:



SERVING more students who can benefit from a Xavier education.



SUPPORTING more students to ensure their dreams come true.



With increased aid. the financial burden can be lifted. and students can instead focus on academics and a bright future.

Investing in the **Well-Being & Success** of the Entire Student

Today's students also face tremendous demands and stressors — the typical challenges of college life plus the extraordinary challenges of our times: a global pandemic, a national racial reckoning, increasingly divided discourse, and a worsening economic downturn. It is critical that we have institutional supports in place to help keep our students healthy — mentally, physically, and spiritually.



Xavierites deserve to have the resources to thrive, successfully graduate, and go on to serve and better the world with interpersonal skills that transcend life and into the workplace. We will focus on:



360-degree academic support:

Our Biomedical Honor Corps Summer Bridge Program, Pre-Med Intensive Summer Prep Program, Summer Start Institute, additional bridge programs, supplemental instruction, and advisors will provide full academic support at every level and area of study.

Career collaboration and connection: One-on-one support, mock interviews, job search, and

resume instruction will provide students with motivation and strategy to find and land the best jobs and internships that will set them up for success.

An in-house nutritionist, food pantry, community garden, and more will encourage body and brain health so students can thrive in and out of class.

HEALTHY MINDS


Spiritual support: University and interfaith chaplaincy will provide spiritual guidance and grounding when our students need it the most.

Saint Katharine Drexel didn't hesitate in a 1932 New York Times interview when asked why she was investing in a campus for Black students.



Today, Xavierites are taking what they know far beyond its walls, strengthening generations and communities old and new.

We will continue to provide our students with the best, most innovative learning environment by upgrading our campus to match where we know our students can go.

We will make state-of-the-art renovations and begin new construction on enhanced learning and living for our students. We will enrich the entire Xavier community, and we will inspire pride campus-wide by:

Renovating the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament Convent.

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament Convent is in need of repairs and updates. We envision a repurposed Convent as the centerpiece of campus, offering the opportunity for students and others to deepen their

understanding of our Catholic faith and African American tradition.

Modernizing Science Labs to Support Exceptional Study.

Science is one of our signature strengths, but to educate the next generation of scientific and medical leaders, we need more — and more advanced — laboratory space. We will provide cutting-edge

learning and research spaces in labs and update equipment so that students practice skills that will ensure success for graduate school and industry opportunities.




Xavier has a 93% job placement rate. With Xavier's growing visibility as a vital pipeline for diverse and highly skilled talent, our alumni are in demand.

Creating a Sustainable Campus for the Xavier of Tomorrow.


