At my practice site, I currently manage patients with hypertension and diabetes under a collaborative practice agreement (CPA). I will also see patients for medication therapy management and smoking cessation follow-up. For those patients that I see under my CPA, this means I am able to directly adjust all related medications and order necessary laboratory tests in order to manage their disease states more effectively. I am able to bill for all of those services, so I'm currently in the process of working with my clinic to determine the financial value I have added since starting in October 2017.

At DCSNO, the main project I am working on is an NIH grant that will help to determine the impact of pharmacist-led interventions on patients with diabetes that also have other risk factors for metabolic syndrome. Within the College of Pharmacy, I am currently a coadvisor for Kappa Psi and the new class advisor for the P1 class (Class of 2023). I am also working to help establish interprofessional connections between students in the College of Pharmacy and the upcoming students in the new Physician Assistant Program here at Xavier University.

My advice to residents and students is to remember that pharmacy is a small community! The connections you make with your fellow students, faculty, and other members of the profession can truly last a lifetime. Use every opportunity to build yourself as a practitioner and clinician and give yourself the best chance at success!
