


Five Principles of Academic Integrity

In 2001, research study discovered, 70% of the students admitted to cheating on exams, 84% admitted to cheating on written assignments, and 52% copied a few sentences from a website w/o citing the source. The Center for Academic Integrity, part of the Kenan Institute for Ethics at Duke University defines academic integrity as a commitment to five fundamental values:

- Acquired Knowledge
- Effective behavioral patterns
- Mutual Respect
