

COP Pre-Pharmacy Requirements

Students wishing to pursue a Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D) degree through Xavier's College of Pharmacy must complete **57 credit hours** of pre-requisite courses (see table below) prior to being admitted to the Pharm.D. program.

The pre-pharmacy requirements may be completed at Xavier University or any accredited university. All of the pre-requisite course work must be completed prior to enrollment for the academic year applicant is applying for.

**General ethics courses will not be considered in fulfillment of the health ethics requirement at Xavier University of Louisiana. Transfer credit for PHIL 2400 Health Ethics must be a comparable course in either bioethics, medical ethics or health ethics. The required health ethics course must be offered through a philosophy department.

***The required Theology course must have been offered through a Theology or Religion department. Courses offered through other departments such as History, English, Philosophy, or Humanities will not be accepted. However, the College of Pharmacy will accept a Theology course from another institution if it is equivalent to a Theology course taught at Xavier University. The course will have to be approved by Xavier's Theology Department before it is accepted. Biology, Chemistry, and Physics courses for non-science majors will not be accepted by the College of Pharmacy.

The College of Pharmacy will not accept any independent study courses.
