Addressing the Concerns of Saltwater Intrusion in Mid to Late October

Dear Xavierites,

As we are now aware, there is the potential for saltwater intrusion in the New Orleans areas in mid to late October.

While we cannot predict the exact timeline, length or outcomes of this potential saltwater intrusion, Xavier University of Louisiana's leadership team and emergency preparedness team are actively monitoring the situation and working closely with public officials and environmental experts to prepare for any contingencies. We will follow the lead of these experts.

Be advised that tap water throughout the city is currently safe for regular use and that the university is taking steps to ensure the water on campus remains safe for all purposes, including drinking.

Xavier is already taking precautions to ensure the health of its campus community and preparing for any scenario that develops.

This includes securing provisions for temporary water sources with pallets of water secured and scheduled ongoing weekly deliveries to prepare meals, provide drinking water and protect the health and well-being of our community.

We encourage all members of the Xavier community to support each other during this potentially challenging time.

We will do whatever is in our power to mitigate the discomfort and effects of saltwater intrusion and keep you informed throughout the process.
