Executive Summary

The 2020-2021 Xavier University of Louisiana Profile provides information that focuses on freshmen, the student body, graduates, and faculty and staff. The data presented are based on Fall 2020 census data.

Xavier's 2020 freshman class consisted of 712 students of which 311 are in the Biology Department, 126 in the Chemistry Department, and 108 in the Psychology Department. The remaining students chose majors across the College of Arts and Sciences. Eighty-five percent of the freshman class are Black or African American, 5% are Hispanic, 5% are two or more races, 2.5% are Asian, 2% are White, and 1% are non-resident aliens. The freshmen come from 32 states, the District of Columbia, and 4 foreign countries; the top five states are Louisiana, Texas, Georgia, Illinois, and California. The average ACT of the freshman class is 23.0, the average SAT score is 1,089, and the average high school GPA is 3.69.

Xavier's overall student enrollment in Fall 2020 is 3,384, with 2,753 students in the College of Arts and Sciences, 623 students in the College of Pharmacy, and 8 consortium students. Of the 2,753 Arts and Sciences students, 244 are graduate students. Seventy-five percent of the student body is Black or African American, 7% are Asian, 6% are White, 5% are Hispanic, 4% are two or more races, 2% are non-resident aliens, and 2% are unknown.

In 2020, the University awarded 556 degrees, 368 Bachelor's, 40 Master's, and 148 Doctoral. The six-year graduation rate of the 2014 freshman class is 47.3%, and the four-year graduation rate of the 2016 freshman class is 37.4%. The retention rate to the second year for the 2019 freshman class is 78.4%.

In Fall 2020, there are 236 full-time teaching faculty and 9 library faculty at Xavier. Of these, 187 were in the College of Arts and Sciences and 49 were in the College of Pharmacy. Thirty-seven percent of Xavier's teaching faculty are White, 35% are Black or African American, 13% are non-resident alien, 7% are Asian, Native Hawaiian, or Pacific Islander, and 7% are Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Two or More Races, and Unknown Race/Ethnicity. Assistant Professors comprise 42% of the faculty ranks, with 31% Associate Professors, 21% Professors, and 5% Instructors/Lecturers. The University student-faculty ratio was 12.5; the College of Arts and Sciences ratio was 11.8 and the College of Pharmacy's was 13.3. Fifty percent of all faculty are tenured, 31% are non-tenure track, and 18% are tenure track. In addition, 96% of Xavier faculty hold terminal degrees.

There are 439 full-time staff members and 40 part-time staff. Of these, 83% are Black or African American, 6% are White, 5% are non-resident alien, 2% are Hispanic, 2% are Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, 1% are Asian, 1% are two or more races, and 1% are unknown.


