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Executive Summary

The 2022-2023 Xavier University of Louisiana Profile provides information that focuses on freshmen, the student body, graduates, and faculty and staff. The data presented are based on Fall 2022 census data.

Xavier's 2022 freshman class consists of 838 students, with 314 in the Biology Department, 145 in the Psychology Department, and 125 in the Chemistry Department. The remaining students chose majors across the College of Arts and Sciences. Eighty-six percent of the freshman class are Black or African American, 4.4% are two or more races, 4.3% are Hispanic, 2.6% are Asian, 1.2% are White, and 1.3% are U.S. Non-Residents. Freshmen come from 33 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 foreign countries; the top five states are Louisiana, Illinois, Texas, Georgia, and California. The average ACT of the freshman class is 22.7, the average SAT score is 1099, and the average high school GPA is 3.75.

Xavier's overall student enrollment in Fall 2022 is 3,419, with 2,898 students in the College of Arts and Sciences, 518 students in the College of Pharmacy, and 3 consortium students. Of the 2,898 Arts and Sciences students, 205 are graduate students. Eighty percent of the student body is Black or African American, 5% are White, 4% are Asian, 4% are Hispanic, 4% are two or more races, 2% are U.S. Non-Resident, and 2% are unknown.

In 2022, the University awarded 664 degrees: 415 Bachelor's, 99 Master's, and 150 Doctoral. The sixyear graduation rate of the 2016 freshman class is 47.5%, and the four-year graduation rate of the 2018 freshman class is 37.0%. The retention rate into the second year for the 2021 freshman class is 68.0%.

In Fall 2022, there are 249 full-time faculty. Of these, 196 are teaching faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences, 48 are teaching faculty in the College of Pharmacy, and five are library faculty. Thirty-seven percent of Xavier's faculty are Black or African American, 36% percent are White, 14% are U.S. Non-Resident, 7% are Asian, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 7% are Other. Assistant Professors comprise 40% of the faculty ranks, with 29% Associate Professors, 22% Professors, and 9% Instructors/Lecturers. The University student-faculty ratio is 12.6:1; the College of Arts and Sciences ratio is 12.4:1; and ratios of the College of Pharmacy's programs are: 10.6:1 for the Pharmacy program and 12.2:1 for the Physician Assistant Program. Forty-six percent of all faculty are tenured, 33.3% are non-tenure track, and 20.9% are tenure track. In addition, 95% of Xavier faculty hold terminal degrees.

There are 448 full-time staff members and 37 part-time staff. Of these, 81% are Black or African American, 6% are White, 6% are U.S. Non-Resident, 2% are Hispanic, 2% are Two or More Races, 1% are Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, 1% are Asian, and 1% are unknown.
