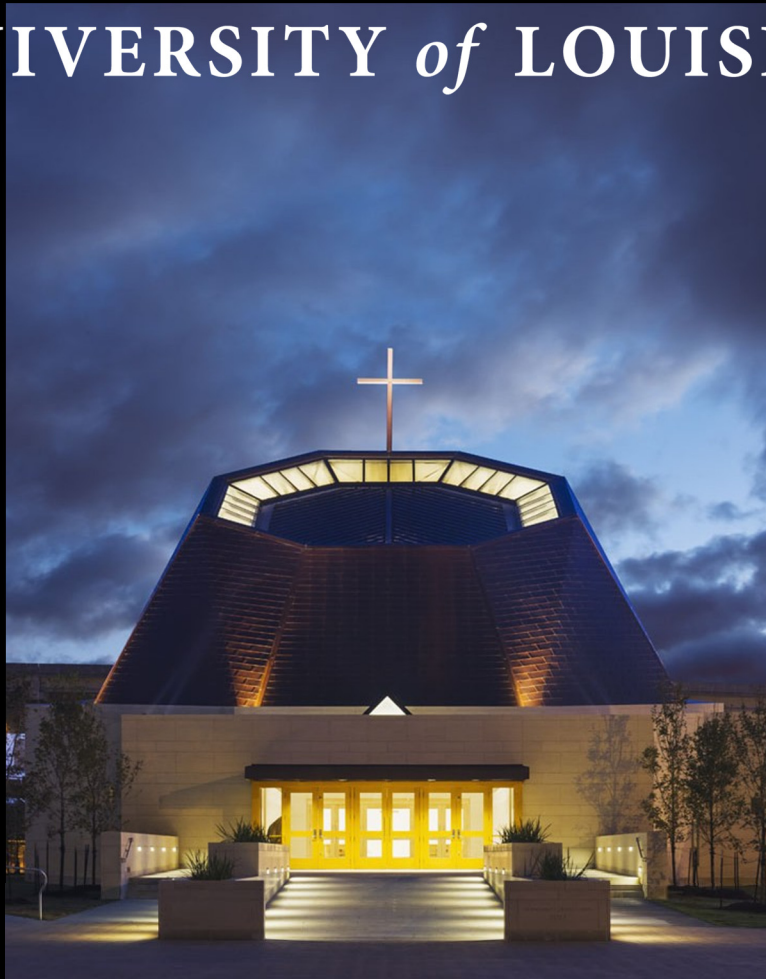

Executive Summary

The 2025-2026 Xavier University of Louisiana Profile provides information that focuses on freshmen, the student body, graduates, and faculty and staff. The data presented are based on the institution's Fall 2025 census data.

Xavier's 2025 freshman class consists of 844 students, with 345 in the Biology Department, 134 in the Psychology Department, and 105 in the Chemistry Department. The remaining students chose majors across the College of Arts and Sciences. 87.9% of the freshman class are Black or African American, 5.6% are Hispanic, 2% are two or more races, 1.5% are Asian, 1.3% are White, and the remainder are Other/Unknown. Freshmen come from 36 states, the District of Columbia, and 8 foreign countries; the top five states are Louisiana, Illinois, Texas, Georgia, and California. The average ACT of the freshman class is 21.4, the average SAT score is 1052, and the average high school GPA is 3.57.

Xavier's overall student enrollment in Fall 2025 is 3,101 with 2,575 undergraduate students and 207 graduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences, 315 students in the College of Pharmacy, and 4 consortium students. 81.7% of the student body is Black or African American, 4.8% are Hispanic, 3.1% are two or more races, 2.9% are Asian, 2.9% are White, and the remainder are Other/Unknown.

In 2025, the University awarded 687 degrees to 683 graduates: 501 Bachelor's degrees, 76 Master's degrees, and 110 Doctoral degrees. The six--year graduation rate of the 2019 freshman class is 52.7%; the four--year graduation rate of the 2021 freshman class is 39.0%. The retention rate into the second year for the 2024 freshman class is 68.4%.

In Fall 2025, there are 256 full-time faculty. Of these, 205 are teaching faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences, 43 are teaching faculty in the College of Pharmacy, and eight are non-teaching library faculty. 37.5% of Xavier's full-time teaching faculty are Black or African American, 31.9% percent are White, 16.1% are U.S. Non-Resident, 8.1% are Asian, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and the remainder are Other/Unknown. 94.8% of Xavier's full-time faculty hold terminal degrees.

The teaching faculty is comprised of 42.7% tenured faculty, 24.6% tenure track, with remaining teaching faculty non-tenure track. Assistant Professors comprise 42.3% of teaching faculty, with 24.2% Professors, 24.2% Associate Professors, and 9.3% Instructors/Lecturers. The University student-faculty ratio is 10.3:1; the College of Arts and Sciences ratio is 10.6:1; and ratios of the College of Pharmacy's programs are: 6.4:1 for the Pharmacy program and 13.2:1 for the Physician Assistant Program.

There are 460 full-time and 22 part-time staff members. Of these, 80.1% are Black or African American, 7.1% are U.S. Non-Resident, 5.8% are White, 2.7% are Hispanic, and the remainder are Other/Unknown.
